

CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How will I receive CLE credit? How long will it take?

To receive CLE credit, please ensure you enter your licensing jurisdiction and State Bar information on the registration form. CLE credit will be processed automatically after the program and may take up to **two weeks**.

2. How do attendees prove attendance at a CLE program?

In-person attendees must complete the sign-in sheet in the meeting room with their name, email, jurisdiction, and bar license information.

Live webcast attendees must sign in to the webcast meeting. During the program, they will be prompted to respond to poll questions via Zoom to verify their attendance.

3. What if I missed a poll question during the program?

There will be multiple polls during the session, as long as you respond to at least two polls, your credit will be processed.

4. In what states is V&E an accredited CLE provider?

V&E is an accredited CLE provider in California, Texas, and New York. Programs sponsored by V&E are presumptively accredited in these states as long as "approved" is stated on the event page. V&E applies for CLE credit for Colorado and Virginia on a per-program basis following the program.

5. What does it mean when the program says "CLE – Pending"?

CLE pending status means the course is still under review. Pending status applies to California, Colorado, Texas, New York, and Virginia.

6. How is CLE credit processed for California, Colorado, Texas, New York, and Virginia?

The reporting process varies by jurisdiction:

California and New York: Participants seeking credit in these states will receive a CLE certificate of attendance post-program for their records.

Colorado: V&E seeks CLE credit approval in Colorado after the program. Participants will receive an email notification upon approval, usually within 2-3 weeks.

Texas: V&E reports directly to the State Bar of Texas. Certificates will not be provided for those seeking credit in Texas.

Virginia: V&E seeks CLE credit approval in Virginia after the program. Participants will receive an email notification upon approval, usually within 4-5 weeks.

7. How do attorneys licensed in states other than California, Colorado, Texas, New York, and Virginia get credit for CLE?

Attendees seeking credit in other states will receive a CLE certificate of attendance that may be used to earn credit through reciprocity or self-admission. If you need more information regarding the program for the self-admission process, please reach out to **Learning and Development**.

8. Does V&E offer Continuing Professional Education (CPE) credit?

V&E offers CPE credit in Texas. For other states, CPE credit may be available through a self-reporting process.
